Pekin Riding Club, INC.
BY-LAWS
Revised/Updated June 9, 2008

ARTICLE I: NAME of the organization

The name of the organization shall be the PEKIN RIDING CLUB, INC. and shall, at all times, be operated and conducted as a non-profit organization in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois providing for such organizations, and by which it shall acquire all such rights granted to clubs of this kind.

ARTICLE II: PURPOSE of the organization

The purpose of the Pekin Riding Club, Inc. is to promote interest in, enjoyment of, and further the education/knowledge of good horsemanship to the mutual advantage of it's membership.

ARTICLE III: PLACE/TIME of business

The principal place of business shall be the Pekin Riding Club clubhouse, grounds and arenas. This land is owned by the club members and has been zoned "agricultural" with a special use permit for the Pekin Riding Club.

The web address is www.pekinridingclub.com. Membership meetings are held the second Monday of each month (except December) at 7:00 PM, unless otherwise decided upon by the membership.

ARTICLE IV: MEMBERSHIP in Pekin Riding Club, Inc.

Section 1: ELIGIBILITY: Any person or persons interested in horses or the sport of riding and the welfare and continued progress of Pekin Riding Club.

Section 2: LIABILITY: The Pekin Riding Club, Inc. will not be responsible for accidents, injuries, or damage to any member or member's livestock or equipment while said member is participating in part or whole as a spectator, member, or official in any event concerning or being presented by the Pekin Riding Club, Inc.

Section 3: DUES and TYPES of MEMBERSHIP: Annual memberships begin on the date of payment of your membership dues and ends on December 31st of the current year.

- A) Single Membership: A \$20.00 annual fee and completion of membership application will entitle member to one vote
- B) Family Membership: A \$40.00 annual fee and completion of membership application will entitle family to two votes. A "family:" is defined as immediate family members residing at the same address
- C) Show Membership: A \$5.00 daily fee with no voting privledges.

ARTICLE V: ELECTION of Officers and Board of Directors

Section 1: The OFFICERS of Pekin Riding Club, Inc. shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary, and/or Treasurer to be elected for a term of one year at the November annual meeting. The BOARD OF DIRECTORS shall consist of seven members to be elected for a term of two years at the November annual meeting. A President who has not been reelected to office, may fill an open position for Board of Directors for a term of two years. Each officer and board member must maintain a membership in good standing to retain their position.

Section 2: DUTIES of the Officers and Board of Directors shall be to manage the business and property of the Pekin Riding Club, Inc. according to the bylaws of the PRC.

- A) The president's duty shall be to preside over all regular/special meetings of the Pekin Riding Club. He/She shall appoint any/all standing or special committees for the proper conduct of the business of the club. The President shall receive any/all communications or petitions from club member or others, relative to the affairs of the club and will refer them to the board and/or membership, as appropriate. He/she will preside over the Board of Directors and will only vote in the event of a tie.
- B) The Vice-President's duty shall be to perform the President's duties in his absence. He/she shall recommend meeting places and shall have general charge of meeting places. Club and arena rentals will be overseen by the Vice-President and will require board approval for each rental request.
- C) The Secretary's duty shall be to accept membership applications and dues and keep a full and accurate record of the membership and the proceedings of all meetings of the organization. He/she shall send notice to the membership of upcoming activities, special meetings, and otherwise deal with the Pekin Riding Club's necessary correspondence as directed by the President.
- D) The Treasurer's duty shall be to receive all payment of dues and other funds, cash, and all records from the preceding treasurer and to pay such bills as directed by the Board of Directors. He/she shall keep detailed accounts of all transactions and render a full statement of accounts at each general meeting.
 - 1) INTERNAL AUDIT of financial records of the Pekin Riding Club will be done each year by the January meeting (or first meeting after elections) and finished in time for tax reports, if any, need to be filed. This internal audit will be done by three members appointed by the Board of Directors. It is recommended that the incoming treasurer, outgoing treasurer, and a board member comprise the internal audit/review committee. If an problem is noted in the records, the Board of Directors will decide if there is reason for any outside audit to be performed. An internal audit may be called for at any time during the year by a majority vote of the membership.

Section 3: RETIRING OFFICERS shall deliver to the President any/all record books, receipts, papers or other property belonging to the club within two weeks.

Section 4: REMOVAL OF AN ELECTED/APPOINTED officer, board member or club member may be requested for their actions conflicting with the purpose and/or bylaws of the Pekin Riding Club or for three (3) unexcused absences from monthly meetings in the case of board members. Removal must be done by a unanimous vote of the Board of Directors (remaining Board of Directors if officer/board member is involved). If an officer or board member is removed, the vacancy will be filled as per bylaws for an open position. Any/all record books, receipts, papers, or other property belonging to the club must be delivered to the President within two weeks.

Section 5: BOARD MEETINGS will be held at 6 PM monthly (except December), the second Monday of the month, before the general membership meeting. A quorum will be reached with seven board members present to conduct board business. An "emergency" board meeting may be called by the President, if needed, to address any special/emergent business of the Pekin Riding Club.

ARTICLE VI: GENERAL MEETINGS

Section 1: MONTHLY MEETINGS shall be held at 7 PM, the second Monday of each month (except December) unless otherwise notified. The meeting place shall be the Pekin Riding Clubhouse, located on the show grounds, unless otherwise notified for a special function. Robert's Rules of Order will be followed for all business meetings. The annual membership meeting shall be held the second Monday of November each year (unless otherwise notified). A "SPECIAL MEETING" may be called by the Board of Directors with three (3) days written notice by the secretary to the entire membership, to include: date, time, place and purpose of the "special meeting".

Section 2: A QUORUM will be reached with fifteen (15) members, which may include board members, for the transaction of club business.

ARTICLE VII: COMMITTEES

Section 1: STANDING COMMITTEES: There shall be seven (7) standing committees consisting of at least three (3) members each: A) Fundraisers, B) House Rules, C) Volunteer Coordination, D) Horse Shows, E) Trail Ride, F) New Member/Welcome committee, and G) Grounds/Building Committee.

- A) The FUNDRAISERS committee shall recommend projects, subjects of study and entertainment and when approved by the board shall prepare and complete all necessary arrangements for carrying out such programs to raise funds for the PRC.
- B) The HOUSE RULES committee (or board of directors) shall interpret the House Rules when called upon by the President and develop general rules as needed for additional activities, such as, club/arena rentals, sponsorships, etc.
- C) The VOLUNTEER COORDINATION committee shall organize volunteers needed for any/all PRC sponsored events, encourage membership volunteers, seek new volunteer recruits, and coordinate all volunteer activities.
- D) The HORSE SHOW committee shall draw up a set of standing rules, to be approved by the board of directors, to schedule, organize, and conduct horse shows, following ISSHA (Illinois State Stock Horse Association) rules, except for clothing.
- E) The TRAIL RIDE committee shall schedule, set up, and conduct trail rides.
- F) The NEW MEMBERS/WELCOME committee shall be mentors to all new PRC members, address any/all concerns new members may have, and encourage new members participation in club activities.
- G) The GROUNDS and BUILDING committee shall oversee the maintenance and general upkeep of the PRC buildings and grounds.

Section 2: COMMITTEE CHAIRPERSON: shall be elected by the committee members or appointed by the President and will have the authority to delegate duties to committee members, be responsible for actions of the committee, and shall keep the President and/or Treasurer informed of their progress and expenses.

ARTICLE VIII: BYLAWS AMENDMENTS

Section 1: These bylaws may be amended at any meeting by a two-thirds vote of the entire membership. Original bylaws will be stored in the Pekin Riding Club office and updated bylaws are available to each/every member, as they are requested. Previous bylaws revisions have been done in January 1995 and in January 2000. The most current bylaws are dated June 9, 2009.

Section 2: It is the recommendation of the current board that bylaws be revised annually (at the first meeting of the new board) and updated as necessary

Every effort will be made to update both media as soon as possible with show cancellations for weather or other important details. The hotline does not accept voice mail messages, but the email account is checked regularly and we ask that you direct your questions through the email account or directly to any board member.

The Pekin Riding Club has done their best to provide guidelines for how our shows will be run. There will be situations where the board is required to deviate from these rules. The PRC board will work through those cases as they arise and will always do things they believe to be in the best interest of the Pekin Riding Club.

Most importantly, we hope you enjoy your experience with PRC! Please contact any board member if you have questions or concerns. In 2009 all board members will be wearing bright green PRC shirts.

If there is an emergency we ask that the announcer stand make the phone call to 911 rather than the entire membership making a call.

If there is a fire, tornado, or other event the PRC board will notify those present of the best course of action via the PA system or by circulating through the grounds.

Membership Requirements

1. Membership is open to horse enthusiasts of all ages and all experience levels.
2. Single Membership is \$20 and for any one person.
3. Family Membership is \$40 and for two adults who are in the same household and any of their children 18 and under who reside there. Grandparents can include grandchildren 18 & under on their family membership.
4. If you are showing as a Temporary Member (good for one evening) there is a \$5 temporary membership fee required and you are required to sign the same liability waiver as a regular member.
5. Memberships expire on December 31st of the year they were purchased regardless of the purchase date. As a courtesy newsletters will continue to be sent to members until March of the next year. At that point if you have not renewed your membership no more newsletters will be sent to you.
6. You may be asked to show your membership card at any time you are on the PRC Grounds.
7. Pekin Riding Club members are allowed to utilize the grounds for riding practice anytime there is not a horse show going on. Please be respectful of our grounds and return everything to the way you found it when you arrived.

General Show Information

1. Shows will be held on Fridays in May and September and on Tuesdays in June, July and August unless otherwise stated on the website, on the hotline or in clubhouse postings.
2. Rain dates for any cancelled Tuesday shows will be on the Friday of that week. There is no rain date for Friday shows.
3. The shows will start at 6:30 PM with registrations opening at 5:30 PM. While we will try to accommodate late entries we ask that you try to register for everything as close to 7 PM as possible.
4. Class fees are \$3 per class.
5. Show clothes are not required for our shows and most people wear jeans and t-shirts when showing. We do ask that you dress appropriately as this is a family friendly environment.
6. Helmets are not required but are strongly recommended for youth riders.
7. We ask that all participants who are on or around horses please wear boots or other appropriate footwear.
8. Horses shall not be tied to trees or fences. If you are unable to find someone to hold your horse please take it back to your trailer.

9. No horses are allowed past the fence boundaries separating the arenas from the clubhouse area.
10. Any participant abusing their equine friend will lose their points for that day and repeat offenses will cause a person to lose their good standing as a member.
11. As a safety precaution we ask that you keep your horses to a walk when traveling between arenas or around spectators.
12. Spectators are not allowed to sit on the arena fence.
13. We ask that you please keep a watchful eye on your small children. Horses are unpredictable animals and we do not want anyone hurt.
14. Alcohol is prohibited on Pekin Riding Club grounds and people caught with alcohol will be asked to leave by one of the board members.
15. Dogs are required to be on a leash at all times and are not allowed in the clubhouse.
16. Pekin Riding Club is utilizing the Illinois Guidelines for Junior Horse Shows as the show rulebook. These rules are available on our website. Judges will be familiar with these rules and PRC will look for certified judges, judges who are in a training program like what is available through BlackHawk College, judges who are part of Horse Judging Teams or local judges with good recommendations.
17. There are two exceptions to the Junior Horse Show rules.
 - a. Horsemanship/Equitation will be run as a pattern class only and will not include rail work.
 - b. Trail class may or may not use the same mandatory obstacles and gaits. Patterns will be at the discretion of the Pekin Riding Club board and judges.
18. Showmanship and Horsemanship/Equitation class patterns will be available on the Pekin Riding Club website and in the clubhouse. There are 5 patterns for each class. Week 1 of the month will use pattern 1, week 2 will use pattern 2 and so on. See the end of this booklet for the current patterns.
19. The judge's decision is final. We respect the opinions of our judges and will not change or overturn any of their placings. If you have a concern with the judge please bring that concern to the Pekin Riding Club board and we will address it appropriately.
20. Horses that are acting unruly in class will be excused immediately from the class by pulling the horse to the center or asking it to leave the arena. A second episode at the same show will excuse the horse for the remainder of the show. Only the judge and ring steward are authorized to determine poor conduct. Spectators cannot determine what is an unruly horse. A horse voluntarily pulled in to the center by the exhibitor will not be penalized.
21. Judges will place up to 6 places in each class.
22. Once the announcer has asked for the gate to be closed and stated that the class is now being judged no additional riders will be allowed in.

23. Exhibitors will be allowed a window in getting to their class for either a tack change or coming directly from another arena. There is a 2-minute limit on entering the arena once the class/exhibitor has been called, the gate has been opened and/or the first horse has entered the ring. This may be extended up to 5 minutes for a tack change.
24. Once the run order for a speed class is posted there will be no deviations from that run order. We will attempt to post run orders for speed classes 20-26 by around 6:30 pm and all others around 7 PM. Run order will be a random draw, but we will try to accommodate riders on two horses
25. NO VERBAL ABUSE OR YELLING shall be directed at the judge, members of the show staff, other participants or board members based on our mission and values. Anyone who does and is reported will lose all points for the day and will be dismissed from the show immediately with no refund of any entry fees. Repeat violations will result in your membership being revoked. If there is an issue that needs to be addressed please take it to a member of the Pekin Riding Club board and a decision will be reached by a majority of the board present at the show or larger issues will be taken to an emergency board meeting with the entire board present.
26. **No stallions will be shown by exhibitors under 18.**
27. Safety is a key priority and therefore speed event exhibitors will NOT BE ALLOWED to run in or out of the gate when executing their pattern. Horses will enter the arena under control and the gate will remain closed after a pattern until the horse is brought to a stop.
28. We ask that unmounted participants only enter the speed warm up arena to briefly help a participant and that they promptly exit. When mounted in the warm up arena it is much appreciated by other members if you do not stop your horse and stand. This prevents other people from warming up effectively. If you need to stop and stand please consider going outside the warm up arena.
29. All timed events will be timed with an electronic eye and recorded to the thousandth of a second.
30. A no time will be given for breaking a pattern.
31. Rerunning a pattern will only be allowed if the electronic eye failed to work properly. A contestant will be given the option of running again immediately or waiting until the end of the running order.
32. Tack is required for all speed events and the arena will run as it stands.
33. Rules and showbill may be subject to change without notice. Please visit the PRC website or watch for announcements in our clubhouse for any changes.

Lost and Found

1. Any items left behind at shows will be put in our clubhouse for identification and retrieval at a later show.

Volunteers

2. The Pekin Riding Club is always in need of volunteers and we ask that you help us during shows when and where you can. Help is always needed with gates, handing out ribbons, announcing, etc. Feel free to visit with a board member if you are available to help.
3. **Confirmed** volunteers will be allowed a meal at the concession stand at no charge as a thank you. Please visit with a board member to make sure that you are on the approved list before stopping at the concession stand. Food and drink will not be given out without approvals and only 1 meal per person is allowed.

Concession Stand

1. A concession stand will be available for all Pekin Riding Club shows.

Age Divisons

Youth: Ages 12 and under

Teen: Ages 13 to 18

Adult: Ages 19 and up

1. Age of exhibitor for class registration and year-end awards will be determined as of January 1 of the current year. You are that age for the entire year and should show in the age division that pertains to you. Any exhibitor showing in the wrong age class will not keep points earned in that class unless the error was clearly a show management issue.

2009 Classlist

At each show two different arenas will be active and running at the same time. The western arena (furthest from the highway) or Pleasure arena will run classes 1 through 19. The eastern arena (nearest the highway) or Speed Arena will run all classes from 20 through 35.

13. **Teen Walk-Trot** (ages 13-18, English or Western)
14. **Youth Walk-Trot** (ages 12 and under, English or Western)
15. **Open Country Pleasure** (all ages, Walk & Favorite Gait)
16. **Adult Western Pleasure** (ages 19+)
17. **Teen Western Pleasure** (ages 13-18)
18. **Youth Western Pleasure** (ages 12 and under)
19. **Open Trail Class** (all ages –first show of the month only)
20. **Adult Scudaho** (ages 19+)
21. **Teen Scudaho** (ages 13-18)
22. **Youth Scudaho** (ages 12 and under)
23. **Adult Pole Bending** (ages 19+)
24. **Teen Pole Bending** (ages 13-18)
25. **Youth Pole Bending** (ages 12 and under)

27. **Novice Barrels** – cannot ride in any other speed classes, barrels will be moved in significantly and leadline is allowed but not required

31. **Open Barrels ***** (all ages)
32. **Youth Flags** (ages 12 and under)

Entering A Class

1. It is your responsibility to enter in the correct class and fill out the entry card correctly.
2. An entry is considered made once your card has been turned in at the registration desk. At that point you are responsible for paying the entry and will not receive a refund for scratching a class.
3. Entry cards must be filled out completely. You will not be allowed to ride in a class if you do not have a properly filled out card turned in to the registration desk.
4. Current negative coggins is required.
5. Be consistent in your horse's name when entering. Different names will be viewed as different horses and points will be kept separately.

Jackpot Shows

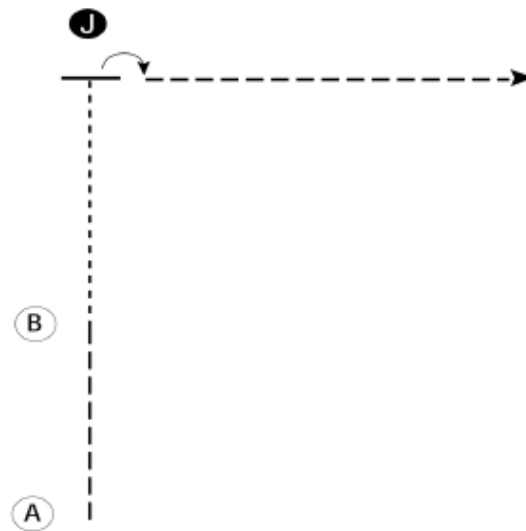
1. There will be three jackpot shows scheduled per year.
2. Jackpot shows will be on the 3rd week of June, July and August.
3. Jackpot shows will have a 70% payback and class fees will be raised to \$10 instead of the usual \$3 class fee.
4. There will be 4 jackpot classes: Open Poles, Open Barrels, Horsemanship/Equitation Walk Trot Only, and Horsemanship/Equitation Walk Trot & Canter.
5. Jackpot checks will not be mailed except in unusual circumstances. Please pick up your check before you leave the Riding Club, but please be patient if your check is not ready immediately. Our shows are run entirely by volunteers and everyone is doing their best to make this a pleasant experience.

Year End Awards and High Point

1. Points are kept on a one-horse one-rider combination. When riding more than one horse, points will be kept on both horses, but will not be combined. You are also responsible for paying entry fees for each horse.
2. Year-end awards are only available to members in good standing and to those people who selected on their membership form that they wanted to be considered for awards.
3. You must be a paid up member of the Pekin Riding Club for any of your show points to count towards the year-end awards. Memberships are not retroactive and your points will not count until the day you pay your yearly dues.
4. Points will be awarded as follows: 1st place = 6 Points, 2nd place = 5 Points, 3rd place = 4 Points, 4th Place = 3 Points, 5th place = 2 Points and 6th Place = 1 Point.

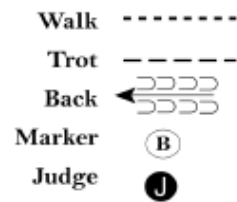
5. All classes except Leadline and Novice Barrels will be counted towards high point.
6. Year end prizes will be given to **ALL** exhibitors in the Leadline and Novice Barrel classes.
7. All awards will be presented at the end of year banquet.
8. Year-end awards for high point will be determined by the budget available for prizes.
9. High point and Reserve High Point will be offered for the Pleasure arena and the Speed arena in all age divisions. Points will not cross arenas when tallied (ex: A person who earns a 1st place in Stock Horse Halter and a 1st place in Open Barrels now has 6 points towards Pleasure High Point and 6 points towards Speed High Point – not 12 points total).
10. Year end prizes will be given to the three (3) people with the highest points in each individual class. Leadline and Novice Barrels will not follow this procedure as detailed in #5 and #6.
11. Exhibitor must show in at least five (5) shows to be eligible for year end awards.
12. In the event of a tie for end of year awards it will be broken using the following method:
First, the number of shows each horse and rider participated in. If there is still a tie, it will go to the person who earned the highest number of first places. If there is still a tie it will not be broken and two awards will be given.
13. Class placings will be posted on the Pekin Riding Club website after each show, but points accumulated towards high point will not be shown. We like there to be some mystery in the year end awards!

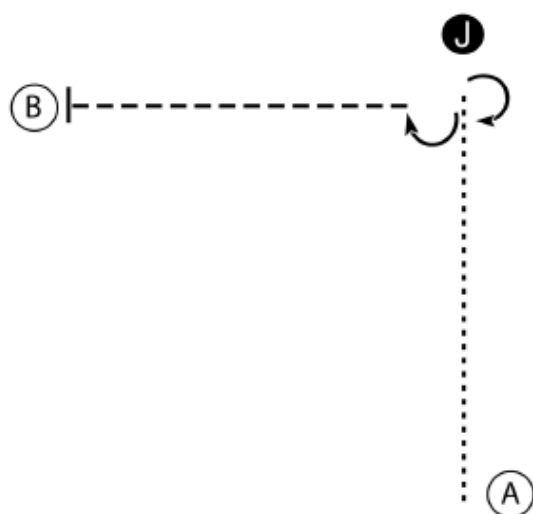

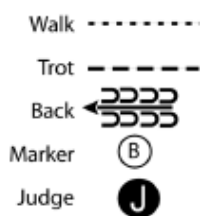
1. Trot from A to B.

5. Trot away from judge and follow the instructions of your ring steward.



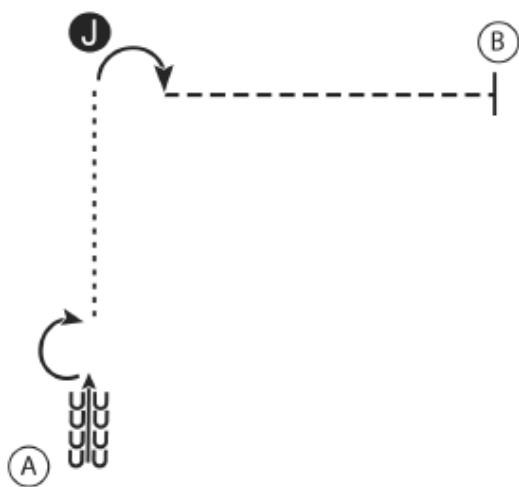
Pekin Riding Club Showmanship Pattern #2



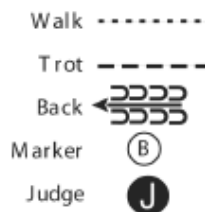
1. Walk from A to the Judge.

5. Stop at B.



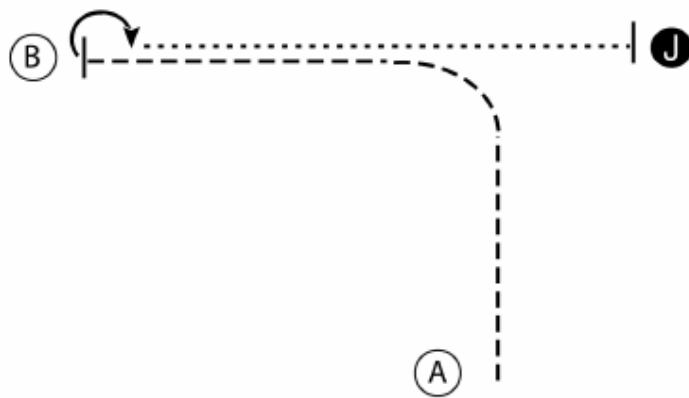
Pekin Riding Club Showmanship Pattern #3



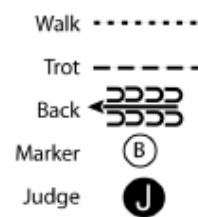
1. Back 4 steps at A

5. Stop at B



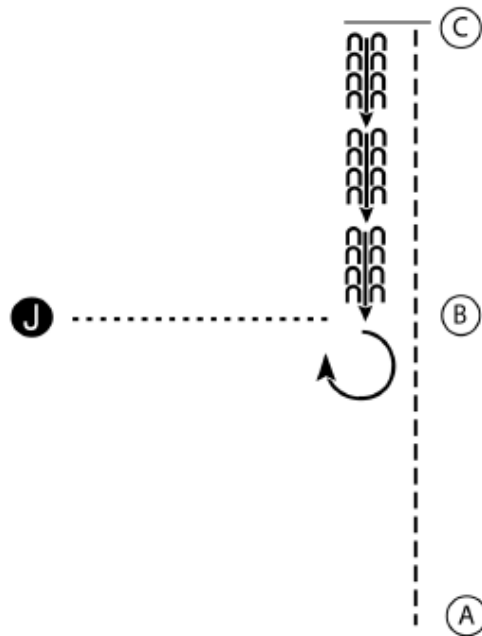
Pekin Riding Club Showmanship Pattern #4



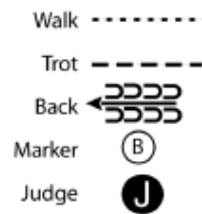
1. Trot from A to B.

4. When dismissed follow instructions of ring steward.



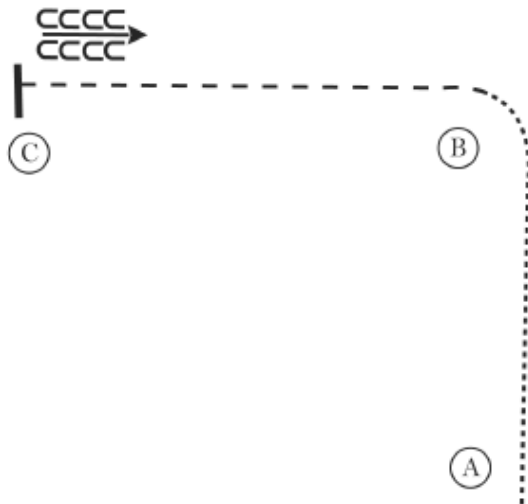
Pekin Riding Club Showmanship Pattern #5

6. When dismissed walk to line-up.



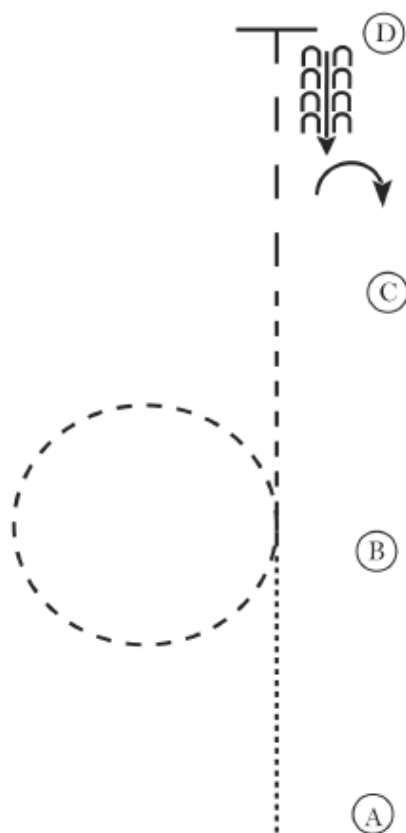
Pekin Riding Club Horsemanship/Equitation Walk Trot Only Pattern #1



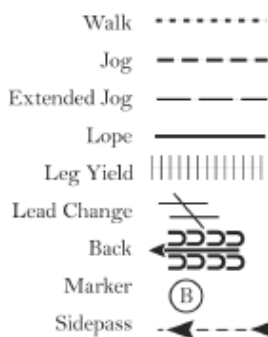
1. Walk A to B

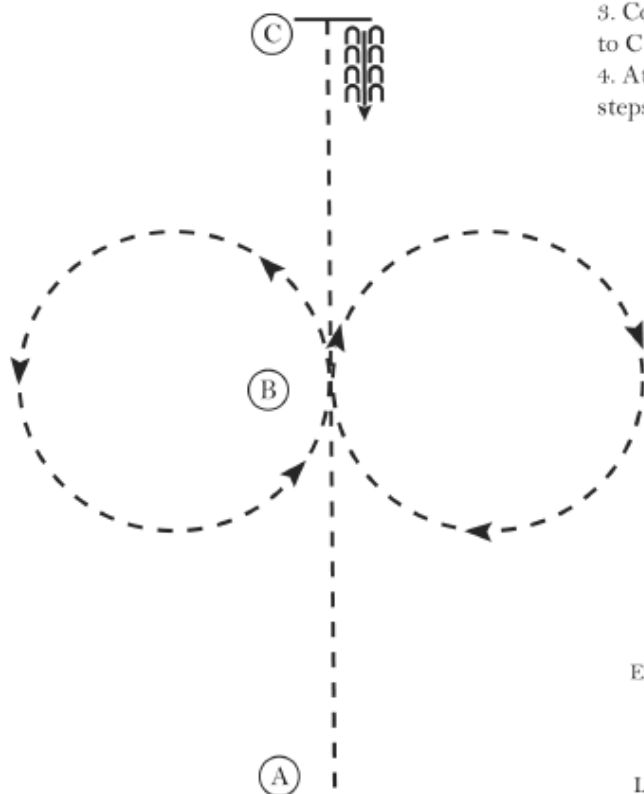


1. Walk A to B.

4. At C extend the jog to D.
5. At D stop and back 4 steps.
6. Turn 90 degrees to the right.

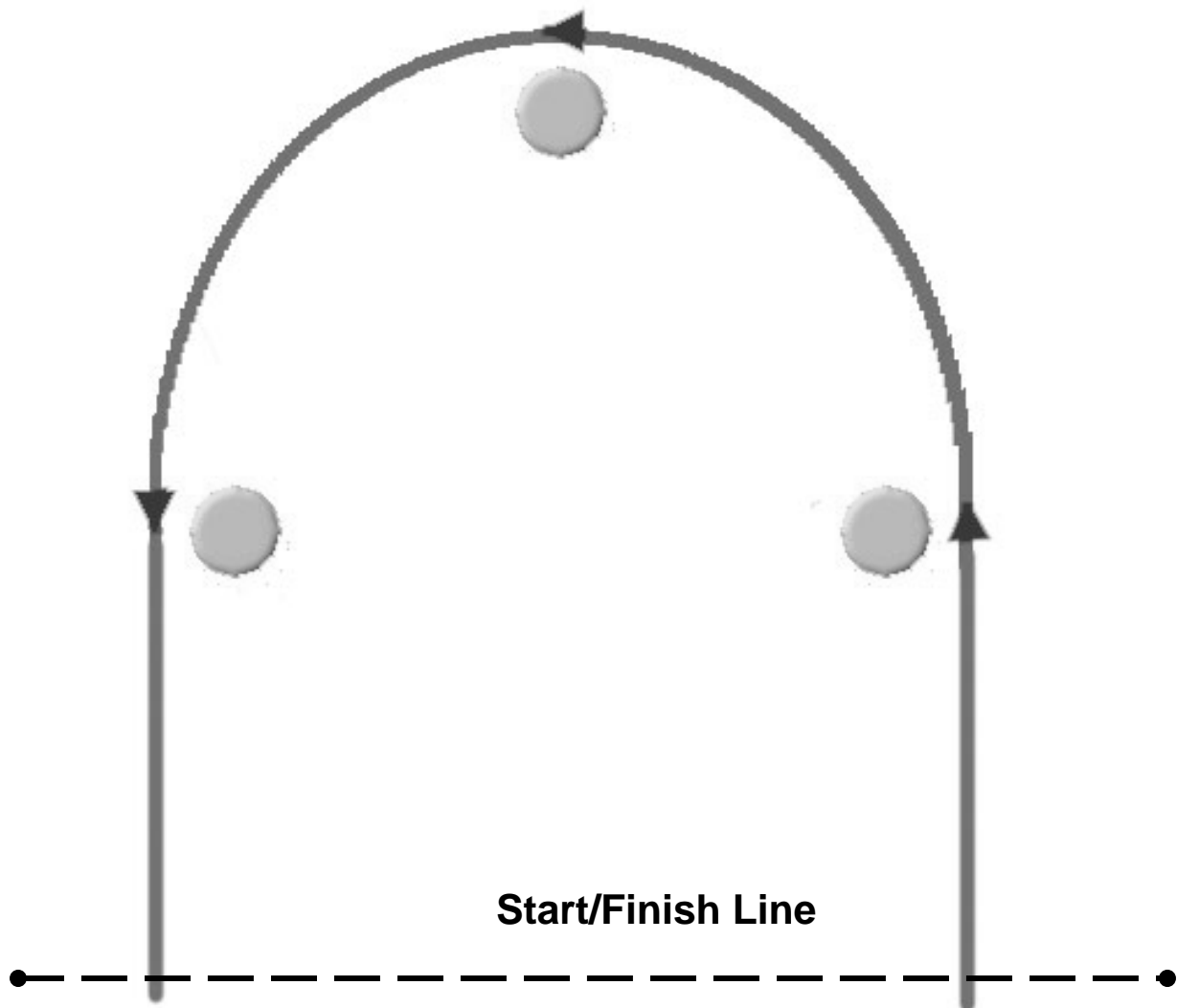

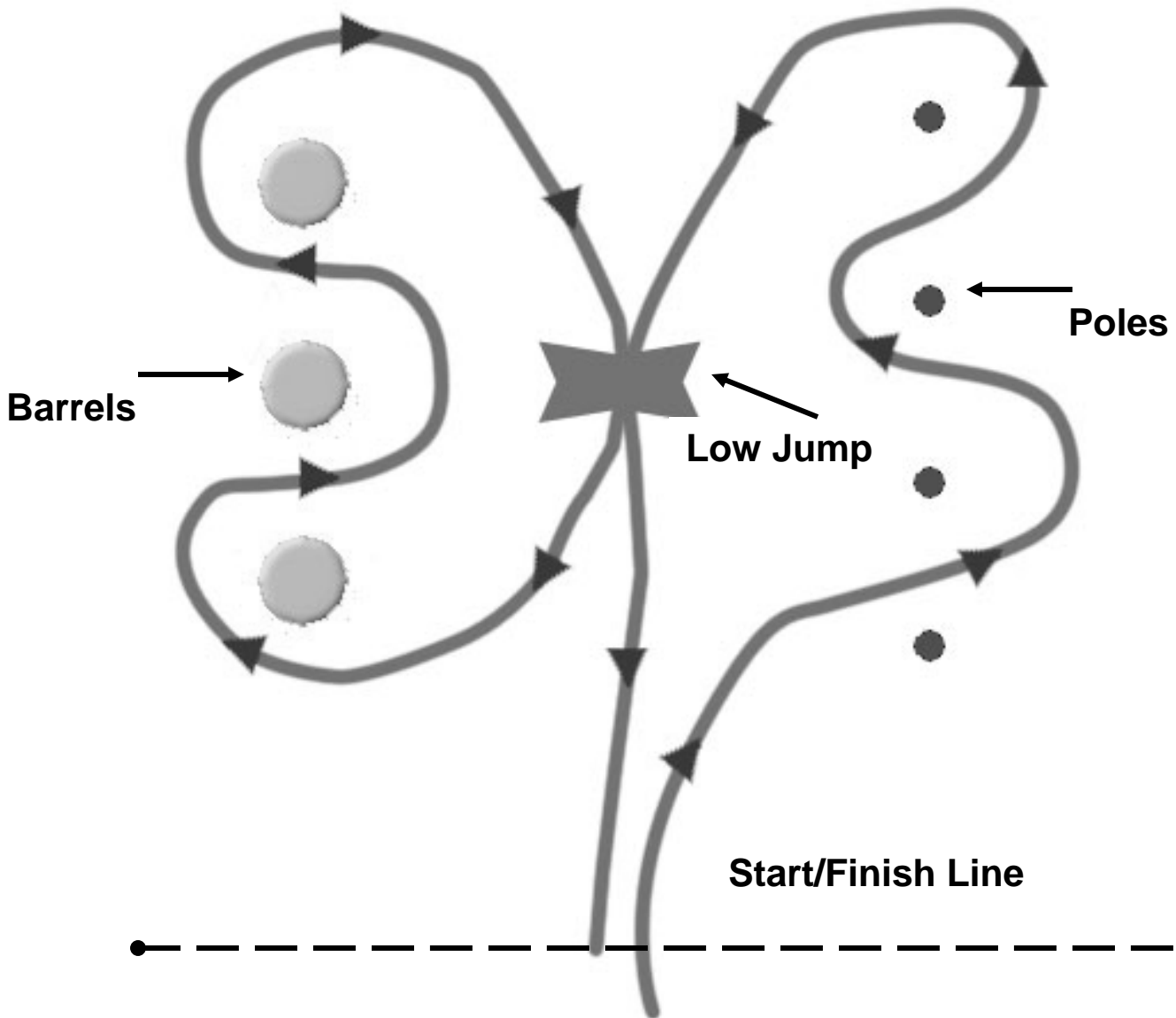

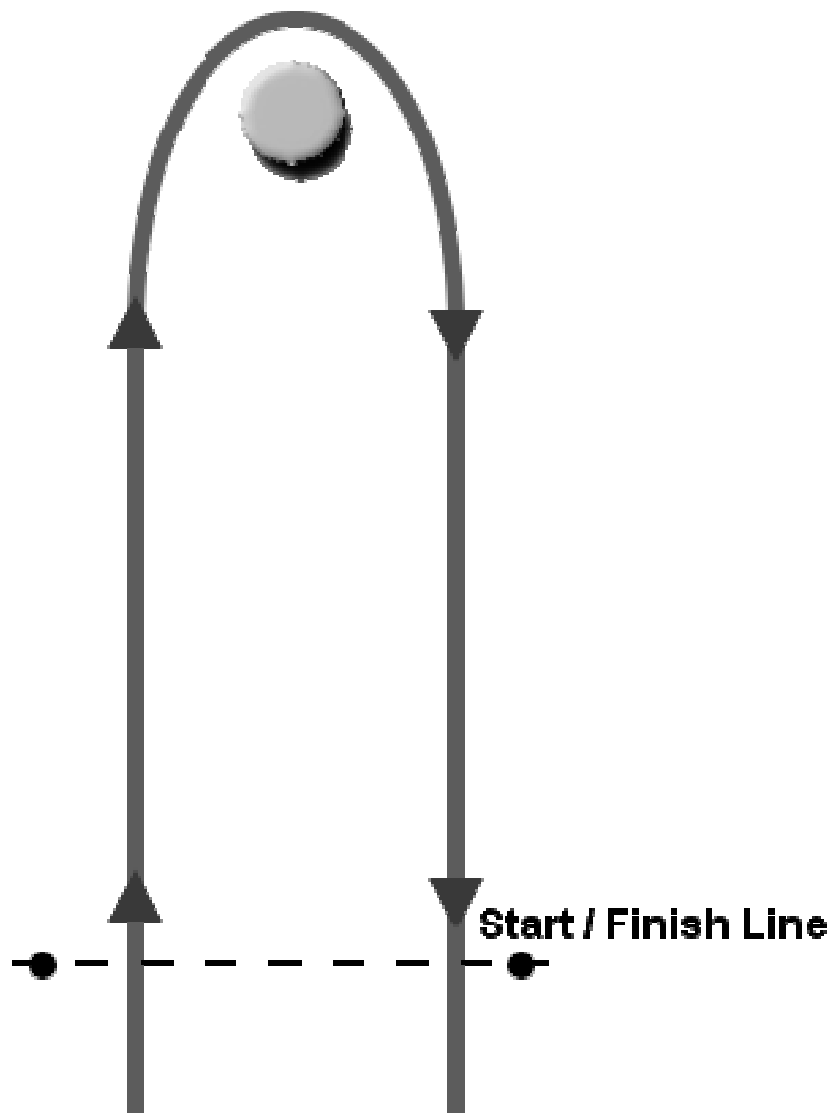

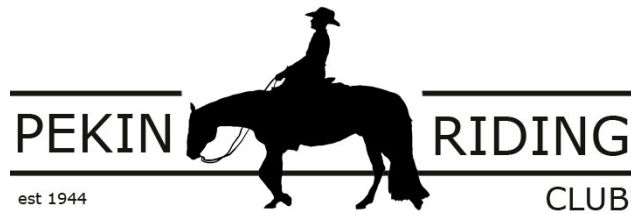
Pekin Riding Club Plug Race

Pekin Riding Club Rental Procedures

1. The Pekin Riding Club clubhouse is available for members to rent provided the following criteria are met.
 - a. The renter must meet with a PRC board member to provide information on their event and the board will vote to allow the rental.
 - b. There is a \$50 fee that must be provided before the event starts.
 - c. The renter must have Pekin Riding Club as a rider on their homeowners insurance and must show proof of that insurance.
2. The Pekin Riding Club arenas are also available for rental at the rates of \$125/day if the renter has their own insurance and \$175 a day if the renter needs to use the PRC insurance. Each case will have a \$3/day or \$5 /weekend office fee per rider.
3. See the following documents for clubhouse rentals.



Thank you for your interest in renting the Pekin Riding Club, Inc.'s arenas. Listed below are the requirements PRC has established for ground rentals. If you have any questions regarding any of the steps, please feel free to contact me at 309-202-6008.

1. The rental of Pekin Riding Club, Inc. is on a first come, first serve basis. No dates will be saved unless the rental fee and all requirements have been met.
2. PRC has the right to refuse rental to any organization.
3. All PRC ground and club rules must be followed. A copy of these rules are included in the packet of information for you. It is your club's responsibility to insure these rules are followed.
4. PRC has first rights to concession stand food sales
5. Rain dates will try to be granted, but due to other obligations, cannot be guaranteed.
6. The rental fee for the arenas is set at \$125.00 per day with a \$3.00 per rider a day grounds fee or \$5.00 per rider for the weekend. This rate is if the organization is providing their own insurance. If PRC is providing the insurance, the rental fee is \$175.00 per day with the same rider grounds fee as above.
7. The insurance provided must cover all riders.
8. A waiver must be signed by all riders.
9. The rental application, rental fee and proof of insurance should be sent to the vice president so they can submit it to the officers and board of directors at the next meeting. The board meets the second Monday of each month. The vice president is in charge of all club/arena rentals.
10. The organization renting the facilities is in charge of running their event. PRC will not provide any workers .
11. The arena footing will be maintained and prepared by PRC.
12. A PRC representative will be in the announcer's stand at the beginning of the show to demonstrate equipment usage.
